Agricultural Disasters: Planning and Recovery meeting will be Thursday, September 4, 2025 at the Hopkins County Cooperative Extension Service; located at 25 Mahr Park Drive in Madisonville. *Please note this is the new location of the Hopkins County Office.* The meeting will begin at 1:30 PM and will last for approximately one hour. This educational meeting will focus on strategies and resources to help agricultural producers prepare for, respond to, and recover from natural disasters and other emergencies. Boomless Pasture and Hay Field Sprayer Clinic will be Monday, September 15 beginning at 5:30 PM. The clinic will be held at Jeremy McGill's farm located at 669 Carter Creek Road in Greenville. Topics include calibrating a boomless sprayer and utilizing a guidance system. Please contact the Muhlenberg County Extension Service by Thursday, September 4 to sign up. *This meeting will be a CAIP educational approved meeting.*

Paradise Beekeepers Association will be hosting a field day on Saturday, September 27, 2025. The time and location will be determined at the August meeting.

Forage seeding can begin as early as August 10 and can continue through mid September. Alfalfa and cool season grasses such as orchardgrass and endophyte friendly fescue are good options for this time period. Kentucky 31 fescue can be seeded through the first week of October. If preparing a conventional seed bed, disking, cultipacking, seeding, and then cultipacking the opposite direction will insure a firm seedbed. For no till planting, competition from other

plants should be minimal. Once the seed germinates, it needs light.

They will be available for pickup through August 29. **Completed applications must be turned in at the Muhlenberg County Cooperative Extension Service on or before 4:00 PM on August 29, 2025.
